

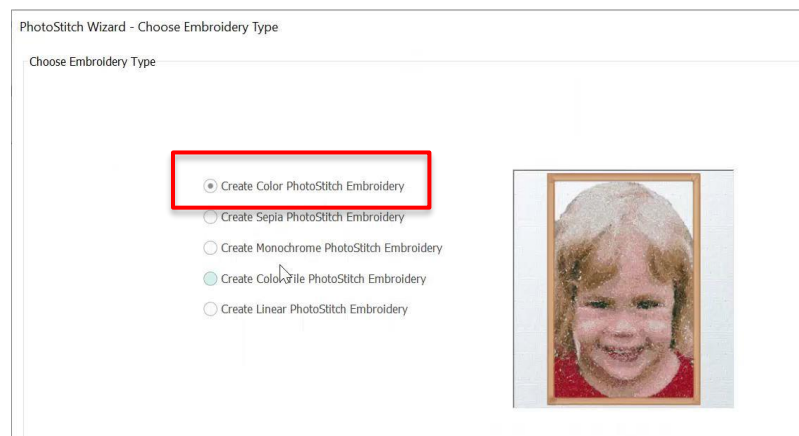
# PhotoStitch Sunflower

mySewnet™ Software GOLD and PLATINUM level project

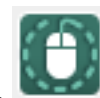


Make embroideries quickly from photos! Use the **mySewnet™ PhotoStitch Wizard** to create embroideries from photos. In this lesson, you will use the **Create Color PhotoStitch Embroidery** option.



## Getting ready

1. Double-click to open the **mySewnet™ Embroidery System**.
2. Double-click to open the **Tools folder**.





3. Double-click to open **Configure**.
4. Select **Utilities** tab.
5. Click **Reset All Modules**.

Note: Resetting All Modules ensures that all settings are at their original point.

6. Click the **OK** button as needed to finish the Reset process.
7. Click on the **Appearance** tab.
8. In **Background**, bottom row, choose the **white** color.
9. Click **Apply**.
10. Click **OK** to close Configure.

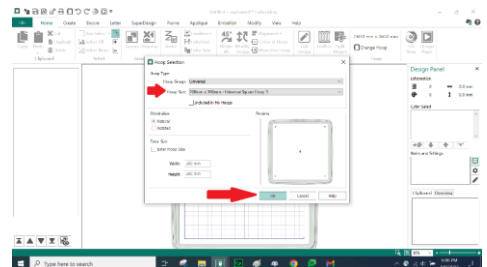
## Open a Blank Canvas

11. In the Welcome screen, choose **Blank Canvas**.



**Blank Canvas**  
Start a new project with no content.

12. Choose **Universal Hoop Group, 260x260mm, Universal Square Hoop 5, Natural Orientation** then click **OK**.



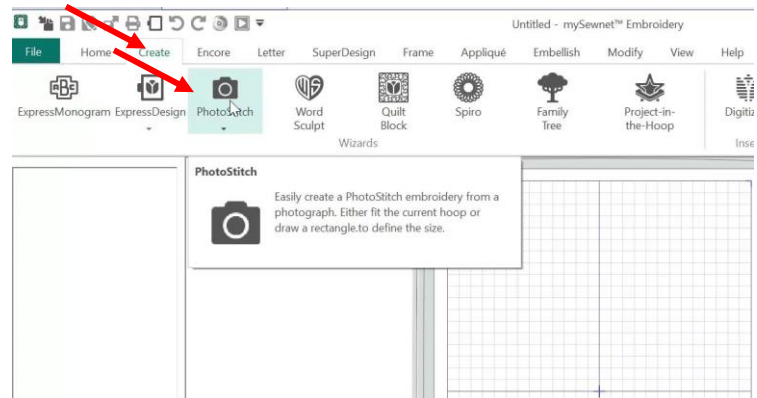
Note: The hoop size will determine the size of your Sunflower embroidery.

13. Download the **Sunflower.jpg** attached to this lesson and **save it** on your computer.

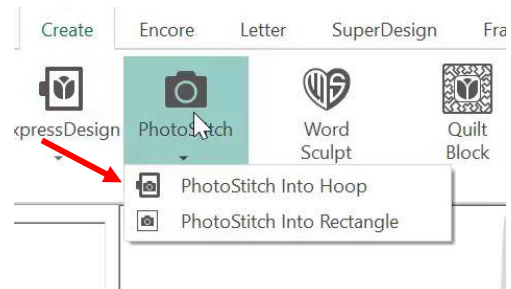


## Open The PhotoStitch Wizard

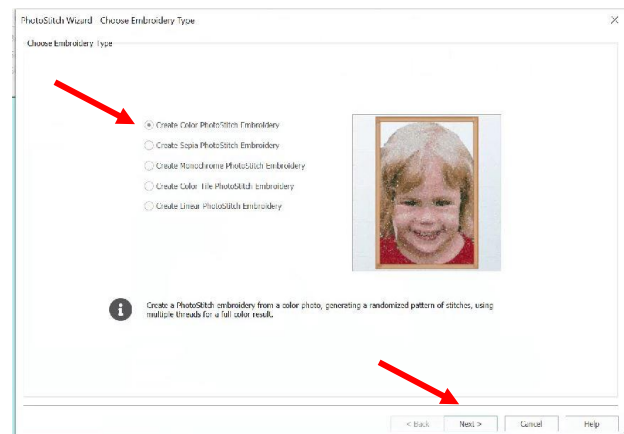
14. Click on the **Create** Tab.
15. In **Wizards**, Click on **PhotoStitch**.



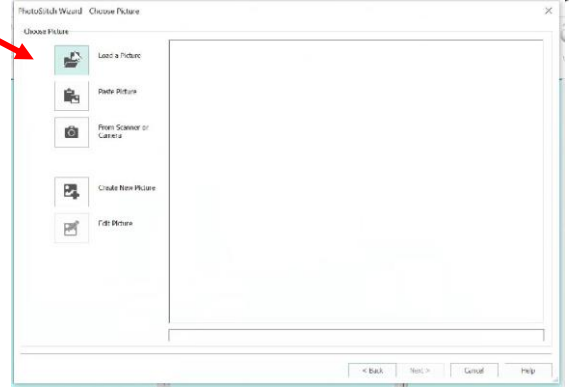
16. Choose **PhotoStitch Into Hoop**.



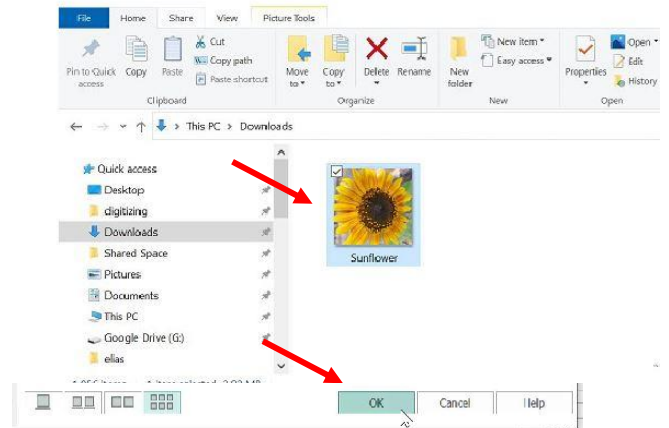
17. Click on **Create Color PhotoStitch Embroidery**.
18. Click **Next**.



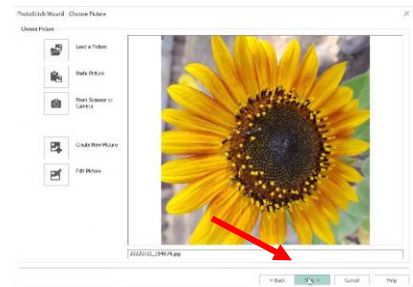
19. Click **Load a Picture**. Locate the **Sunflower** picture you downloaded earlier.



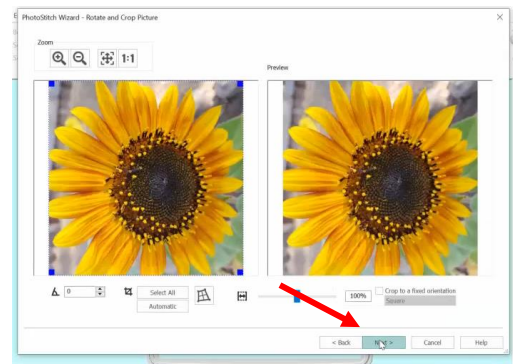
20. **Click** on the picture.  
21. Click **OK**.



22. Click **Next**.

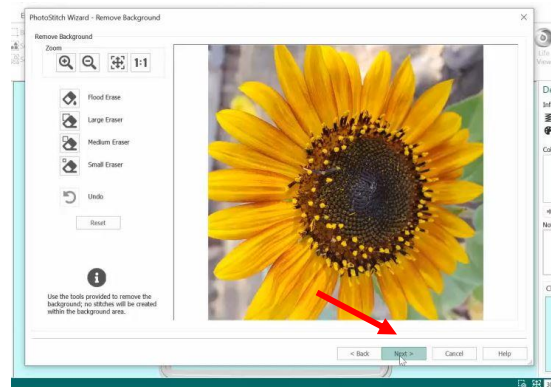


23. Click **Next**.



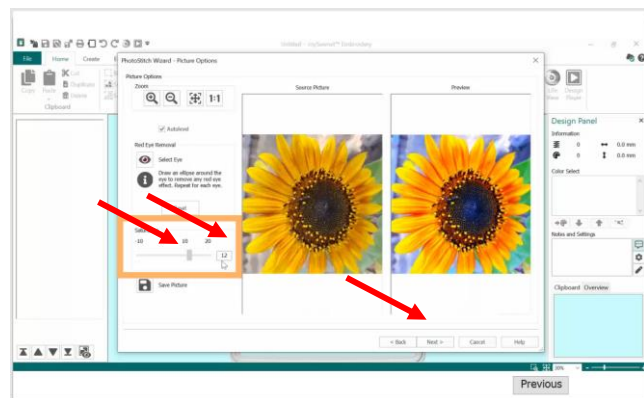
Note: At this point you could erase some of the background, but for this exercise leave it as is.

24. Click **Next**.



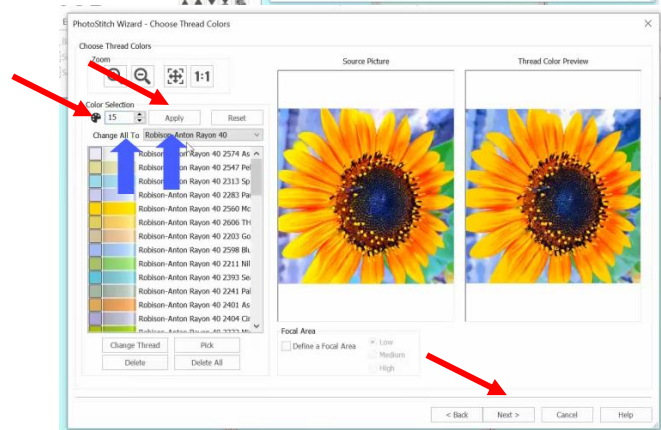
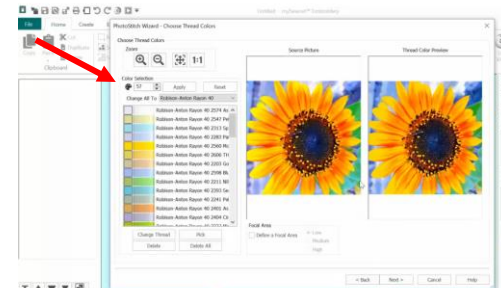
Note: Increase the vibrancy of the photo by increasing the saturation.

25. Type in **12** in the box or move the slider to **12**.
26. Click **Next**.



Note: PhotoStitch will automatically pick the colors and the amount of colors. It generated 57 colors which is too detailed, and we don't need that many for a great embroidery. So, we will change that.

27. Type **15** in the box.
28. Click **Apply**.
29. Click **Next**.

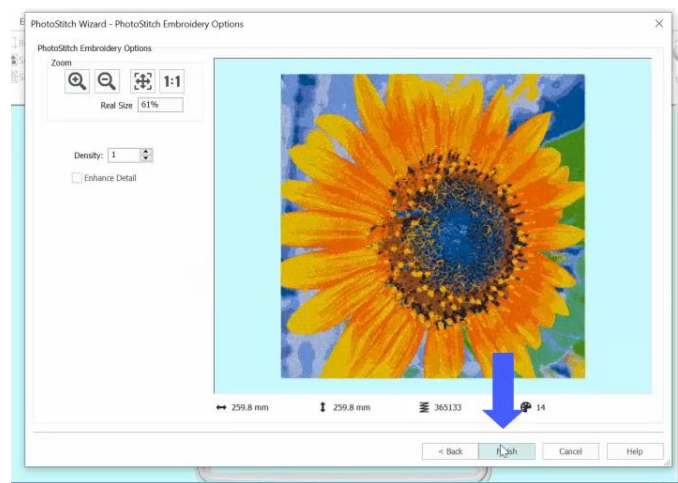




Now PhotoStitch will generate the embroidery. It will take about 6 minutes to generate this embroidery with 15 colors. You could also use less colors, but you will have less details. Here is a side-by-side example of 9 colors versus 15.

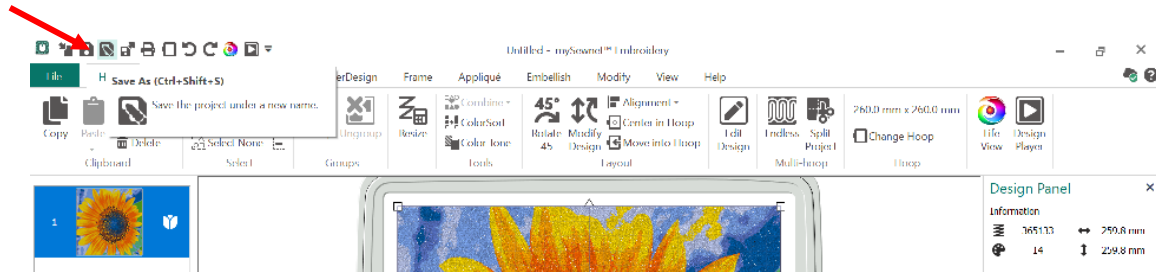


30. Click **Finish** when the embroidery is finished.

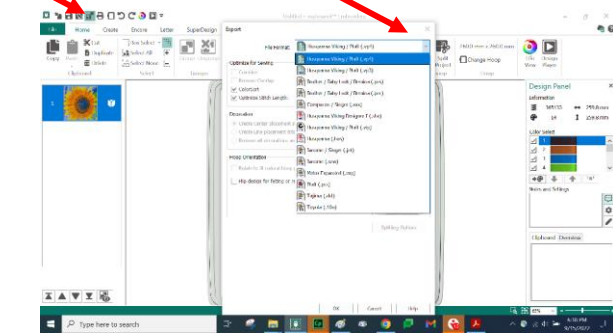


You can save or stitch out the design. Here are 3 options:

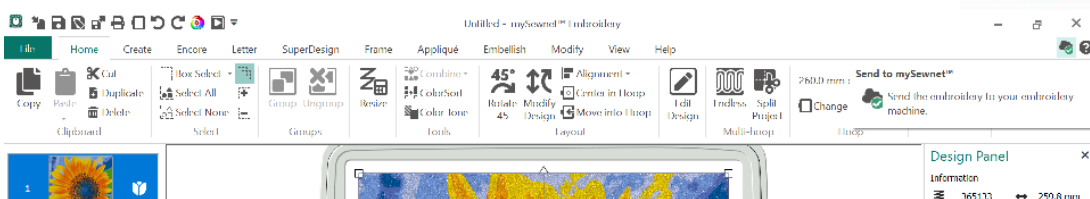
31. Click **Save As**. This will save as a .vp4 format where you can come back in and edit the file as needed.



32. Click **Export**. The Export screen is where you save it for your machine format.



33. Click **Send to mySewnet** to send the embroidery directly to your mySewnet™ enabled machine.

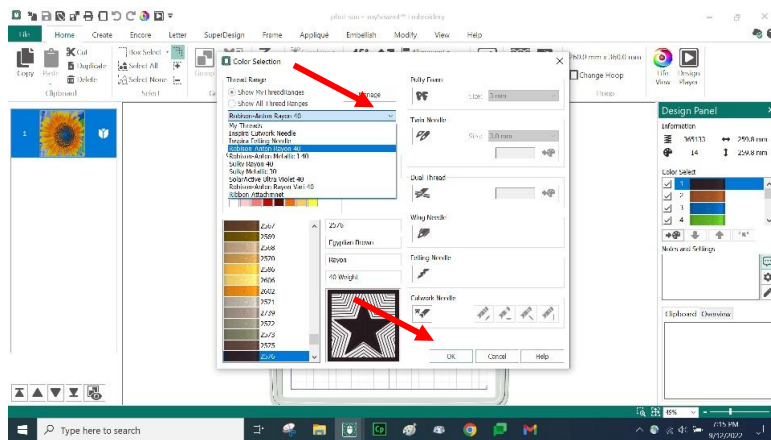


Note: Before you save or stitch out, you can change the colors of the design using the Color Select Box.

34. Double click on **color number one**.



- 35. Click on the **Thread Range** drop down arrow to see all the thread manufacturers you can choose from.
- 36. **Change** the color or colors if desired.
- 37. When finished click **OK**.





You can also change the colors of the embroidery as you stitch it out.



This Sunflower embroidery looks stunning stitched out and would be great in any project.
