

## Mystical Whimsy Quilt – Class 1

### **Confetti Cloth**

Confetti cloth is created with a base fabric that has threads, yarn and glitter sprinkled on top then covered with sheer organza. The layers are stitched together using decorative thread and a decorative stitch.

# **Confetti Cloth for Piecing**

#### **Sewing Machine Preparations**

- 1. Insert a PFAFF<sup>®</sup> Topstitch Needle Size 90/14 in your PFAFF<sup>®</sup> sewing machine.
- 2. Attach the Extension Table, this will give you a larger sewing surface and better support for your project.
- 3. Thread with Robison-Anton Metallic Embroidery thread on top and Robison-Anton Poly Filament Bobbin thread on the bobbin.
- 4. Attach the Multi-line Decorative Foot to your PFAFF<sup>®</sup> sewing machine.
- 5. Select a decorative stitch. Note: Decorative stitches that use forward motion work best (avoid stitches with too much backward motion or side motion). Some stitch suggestions are the 9mm Quilt Stippling Stitches or Zigzag Stitches.






#### **Fabric Preparation**

- Press the 19" x 30" piece of Fabric #4a with a SINGER<sup>®</sup> Steam Iron set on Cotton using steam.
- 2. Place the fabric right side up on a flat surface.
- 3. Spray the entire piece with Temporary Spray Adhesive.
- Cut Candlelight Metallic Yarn, Pearl Crown Rayon, Yarn, Cording, and Decorative Thread into small pieces and scatter across the fabric.











- 6. Press the 19" x 30" piece of sheer organza (Fabric #4b) with a SINGER<sup>®</sup> Steam Iron set on Silk using steam.
- 7. Place the sheer organza on top of the base fabric and safety pin in place.



## **Sewing Instructions**

1. Sew your chosen decorative stitch in lines across the entire piece of fabric.



- 2. Line up one of the lines on the Multi-line Presser Foot along the previous sewn line.
- 3. Remove the safety pins along the way.
- 4. Continue to sew until the entire piece is stitched in both directions creating a grid with the stitches.






## creative icon<sup>™</sup> 2 Instructions using the Projector

- 1. Use the **Projector** and **Grid** to create lines to assist you in following the stitches. Turn **Projection** on.
- 2. Set the Projector Brightness to full.
- 3. Turn on the **Stitch Preview** and select a color that will show up on your fabric.
- 4. Turn on the Grid.
- 5. Set the **Grid Size** by touching in the center of the **Grid Size** number to bring up the number panel and type in the size you want your grid and touch **OK**. Tip: Set the grid so the grid lines will line up with the lines on the Multi-line Decorative Foot.
- 6. Set the Grid Color to a color you can see on your fabric.





7. Line up the Multi-line Presser Foot and the grid along the previous sewn line.



8. Continue to sew until the entire piece is stitched in both directions creating a grid with the stitches.

#### **Cutting Instructions**


- 1. Press with a SINGER<sup>®</sup> Steam Iron set on Silk using steam and a pressing cloth.
- 2. Cut the following:


1(5" x 6") Quilt Label (Class 12b) 4(1½" x 25½") Top and Bottom Rows piecing (Class 2) 4(1" x 21") Flange for Ribbon Stitches strip (Class 6) 4(1½" x 15") Diagonal piecing and Center Row – Large panel (Class 4 & 9) 2(1½" x 7½") Center Row – Small panel (Class 9)


# **Confetti Cloth Instructions for Large Circle**

#### Templates

- 1. On the two pieces of Bristol board, using a permanent marker draw the centerlines.
- Use a compass and an extension bar to draw a 22" diameter circle on one piece of Bristol board and a 19" diameter circle on the other piece.
- Cut out the circles using paper scissors. (Yes I said paper scissors!!!)







#### **Sewing Machine Preparations**


- 1. Insert a PFAFF<sup>®</sup> Universal Needle Size 80/12 in your PFAFF<sup>®</sup> sewing machine.
- 2. Thread with 50wt cotton sewing thread on top and on the bobbin.
- 3. Attach the Adjustable Guide Foot for IDT<sup>™</sup> System to your PFAFF<sup>®</sup> sewing machine and engage the IDT<sup>™</sup>.
- 4. Select a Straight Stitch.


#### **Fabric Preparation**

- 1. Press the 23" x 23" piece of Fabric #4a with a SINGER<sup>®</sup> Steam Iron set on Cotton using steam.
- 2. Place the fabric right side up on a flat surface.
- 3. Press the 23" x 23" piece of sheer organza (Fabric #4b) with a SINGER<sup>®</sup> Steam Iron set on Silk using steam.




- 4. Place the sheer organza on top of the base fabric and pin in place.
- 5. Draw the centerlines on the fabric with the water-soluble marker.
- 6. Place the 22" template on top of the fabric matching the drawn centerlines.
- 7. Trace the circle template with the water-soluble marker.
- 8. Remove the template.
- 9. Place the 19" template on top of the fabric matching the drawn centerlines.
- 10. Trace the circle template with the water-soluble marker.
- 11. Remove the template.






#### **Sewing Instructions**

- 1. Set the adjustable grey guide on the Adjustable Guide Foot to the second line on the right (5%" mark).
- 2. Line up the grey guide on the 19" diameter drawn line and sew a straight stitch all the way around the circle.










3. Lift the sheer organza layer up to the stitching line and pin out of the way to secure it.





- 4. Spray the cotton base fabric inside the marked 22" circle area with Temporary Spray Adhesive.
- 5. Cut Candlelight Metallic Yarn, Pearl Crown Rayon, Yarn, Cording, and Decorative Thread into small pieces and scatter on the fabric base.
- 6. Sprinkle various colors of glitter on top.
- 7. Remove the pins and lay the sheer organza back on the cotton base. Pin the layers together.
- Change the foot on the machine to the 1A Fancy Stitch Foot for IDT<sup>™</sup> System and engage the IDT<sup>™</sup>.
- 9. Stitch a straight stitch on the 22" marked line, use the red line in the center of the foot as a guide.











# 10. Trim the excess fabric a ¼" away from the 22" diameter sewn line.

#### **Sewing Machine Preparations**

- 1. Insert a PFAFF<sup>®</sup> Topstitch Needle Size 90/14 in your PFAFF<sup>®</sup> sewing machine.
- 2. Thread with Robison-Anton Metallic Embroidery thread on top and Robison-Anton Poly Filament Bobbin thread on the bobbin.
- 3. Attach the Adjustable Guide Foot for IDT<sup>™</sup> System to your PFAFF<sup>®</sup> sewing machine and engage the IDT<sup>™</sup>.
- 4. Select a decorative stitch. Note: Decorative stitches that use forward motion work best (avoid stitches with too much backward motion or side motion). Some stitch suggestions are the 9mm Quilt Stippling Stitches or Zigzag Stitches.


#### Quilt Stippling Stitches

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- 1. Set the adjustable grey guide on the Adjustable Guide Foot to the second line on the right (⁵⁄₃" mark).
- 2. Line up the grey guide on the stitched 22" diameter line.
- 3. Sew the chosen decorative stitch all the way around the circle.










#### **Zigzag Stitches**





- 4. Set the adjustable grey guide on the Adjustable Guide Foot to the farthest line on the right of the foot (1" mark).
- 5. Line up the grey guide on the stitched 22" diameter line.
- 6. Sew the chosen decorative stitch all the way around the circle.









#### **Sewing Machine Preparations**

- 1. Insert a PFAFF<sup>®</sup> Universal Needle Size 80/12 in your PFAFF<sup>®</sup> sewing machine.
- 2. Thread with 50wt cotton sewing thread on top and on the bobbin.
- 3. Attach the 1A Fancy Stitch Foot for IDT<sup>™</sup> System and engage the IDT<sup>™</sup>.
- 4. Select a Straight Stitch.



#### **Sewing Instructions**

- 1. Place the 2(15" x 23") pieces of PFAFF<sup>®</sup> Whisper Web Mesh Fuse-on Stabilizer, the shiny fusible side together.
- 2. Stitch together using the edge of the foot as a guide for your seam allowance. Leave a 6" opening for turning. Back stitch at the beginning and end of the seams.
- 3. Open the pieced PFAFF<sup>®</sup> Whisper Web Mesh Fuse-on Stabilizer up and lay it on a flat surface with the shiny fusible side up.
- 4. Place the right side of the circle on top of the PFAFF<sup>®</sup> Whisper Web Mesh Fuse-on Stabilizer.
- 5. Pin together.
- 6. Stitch following the sewn line, all the way around the circle. Back stitch at the beginning and end of the seam.
- 7. Trim the excess stabilizer away from the circle.
- 8. Turn right side out through the opening in the stabilizer.
- 9. Place the Appliqué Pressing Sheet on your pressing surface.
- 10. Press the around the entire edge with the SINGER<sup>®</sup> Steam Iron set on Silk. Be sure the stabilizer side is on the Appliqué Pressing Sheet.
- 11. Set the circle aside for the large circle in the center row of the quilt.
